Our Church is open now for "individual private prayer" from Tuesday - Thursday from 9:00AM-12:00PM.


- Masks are to be worn the entire time you are in our church during your private prayer.

# STAY HOME

HELP US WIN THE FIGHT AGAINST COVID-19

**We ask for you to STAY HOME if you have or been exposed to the following:**

- You are 65 years of age or older.
- If you have serious underlying medical conditions such as:
  - If you have chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
  - If you have heart conditions, high blood pressure
  - If you are immuno-compromised
- If you are feeling sick.
- If you have been exposed or think you have been near someone with COVID-19.
- If you care for someone ill at home.
- If you care for children or infants at home.

**Do you know that you are dispensed from your Sunday Mass obligation?**

### What is a Dispensation from Mass?

Dispensation from the diocesan Bishop releases Catholics from fulfilling their Sunday obligation (Mass). This means that if you live in the Diocese of Fresno, the right thing to do is to stay home for your safety and the safety of others during this time of the coronavirus. All persons who are subjects of the Diocese of Fresno no matter where they may be, and all other persons who are actually present in the Diocese of Fresno who are under the obligation, are dispensed from the obligation (cann. 87 §1, 91). Though there is a sadness for not being able to participate at Mass, one should not feel guilty for not going to Mass. You have a free conscience to stay home. Catholics are encouraged to offer up their sickness or pastoral care for the sake of those who are seriously ill and for those who have died.
